Dear Mr. Stark:

This notice is being provided pursuant to the Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act (“WARN”) and Wisconsin’s Business Closing and Mass Layoff Notification law and for purposes limited to WARN and Wisconsin law only.

Chrysler anticipates that it will permanently close its entire engine manufacturing plant located at 5555 30th Avenue, Kenosha, Wisconsin. As a result, it is anticipated that up to approximately 575 employees working at the Kenosha Engine Plant (of which 507 are UAW-represented) will experience an employment loss beginning on or about October 8, 2010 or 14 days thereafter. These actions are expected to be permanent.

Attached to this notice is a listing of the positions that may be affected and the names of the workers who currently hold those positions. In addition, in accordance with Wisconsin law, individual notices are being provided to these workers. “Bumping rights” under the applicable collective bargaining agreement may apply with respect to this action.
